Cockermouth Country Market has "sacrificed" its table cloths to make scrubs bags for the front line workers during this crisis.

Scrubs are being worn by more and more workers to work directly with people affected by the virus, and those in vulnerable situations. At the end of a shift the scrubs are put into a cloth bag and the whole lot goes in the washing machine when the worker gets home. Of course, workers need more than one bag. Cockermouth Country Market-which is closed at the moment- saw the need for these bags and decided to re-purpose its tablecloths, getting some of its sewing producers to create scrubs bags. These will be used at the West Cumberland Hospital for a range of staff, both on the front line, and those in other roles to ensure the virus is kept at bay. The Market had decided to replace their tablecloths anyway, and this seemed a perfect way to use the still good cloth, rather than it go to waste. It might mean the tables have no cloth on for a couple of weeks when we return, but we are sure
